

North 4 or 5. Moderate. Wintry showers. Mainly good.

Faeroes

Northerly 5 to 7. Moderate or rough. Wintry showers. Mainly good.



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

A complex area of low pressure over the United Kingdom will continue to fill, so strong winds will continue to ease. However, the weather is expected to remain changeable.



Niton

A slack area of low pressure centred over Scilly Isles 1008 on Friday evening moves eastwards into mainland Europe during the early hours of Saturday morning. A ridge of high pressure then builds across the whole of Niton during the rest of Saturday. This ridge becomes centred over the UK on Sunday, then moves eastwards before becoming slow moving over the North Sea on Monday. Through Monday a large area of low pressure lies in the mid-Atlantic, centred approximately 52 North 33 West by Monday evening. No hazardous winds are forecast for Niton on Friday evening or during Saturday. Strong winds expected to develop in Fitzroy, Sole and Shannon on Sunday, perhaps increasing at times to gale in Fitzroy. Little change on Monday, although strong winds will also develop in Biscay, Plymouth and Fastnet, perhaps increasing to gale in Shannon.

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Cullercoats


Low centred sea area Fisher 1001 on Friday evening moves east-northeastwards, expected southern Sweden 1008 by Saturday evening. At this time low central pressure 1000 lies northeast of Iceland, centred approximately 70 North 08 West, moving slowly north. A ridge of high pressure builds across UK on Saturday night and during Sunday, becoming slow moving over the North Sea with central pressure 1041 on Monday. Strong winds are likely in North Utsire, South Utsire, Fisher and the north of German Bight on Friday evening. Winds decrease in German Bight on Friday night, but increase to gale at times in North Utsire, South Utsire and Fisher during Saturday. Winds remain strong, increasing to gale at times, in these areas on Sunday, as well as spreading back into German Bight. Winds then decrease on Sunday night with no hazardous winds forecast on Monday.


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
Portpatrick

A slack area of low pressure centred over Scilly Isles 1008 on Friday evening moves eastwards into mainland Europe during the early hours of Saturday morning. By midday on Saturday low 997 lies northeast of Iceland, centred approximately 69 North 08 West, moving slowly north. A ridge of high pressure then builds across Portpatrick on Saturday night and during Sunday, becoming slow moving over the North Sea with central pressure 1041 on Monday morning. Through Monday a large area of low pressure lies in the mid-Atlantic, centred approximately 52 North 33 West by Monday evening. No hazardous winds are forecast for Portpatrick on Friday evening or during Saturday. Strong winds expected to develop in Shannon, Rockall and Bailey on Sunday, perhaps increasing to gale at times. By Sunday evening strong winds or gales expected in Hebrides, Faeroes and Southeast Iceland. Little change on Monday, although wind decrease in Faeroes and Southeast Iceland by Monday evening.


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







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
